It could give a prospective new member a chance to cheaply see if they like the sport.

If you are trying to sell your car, let the buyer have a go. (strictly on a UFUF rule of course.)

All you need to do is let the organisers know when you enter the event that you need a Single Event Drivers Licence. Then you can either, answer the questionnaire online, or do it on the day, listen to a lecture, and then have a quick drive to show that you can handle a vehicle safely. It's easy. Think about it, simple paperwork, have a chat, go for a drive. Hey presto, you're a driver for a weekend!

Best of all, on a nice easy, no pressure club event, teach your teenager how to handle a vehicle in a controlled environment. That way when they get on the road, by themselves, they will have learned skills to help them.

Some states have a special event at the end of each year which is open only to Ladies and Juniors. Is a fun event that gives something back to the families who support the teams all year. If your state does not have an event of this type, why not give it a try? This licence now makes it cheap to enter, and run it as a club event.

This Single Event Drivers Licence gives us something that we can use for a multitude of reasons. We just need to make sure that we do use it this year. We have fought for it, now we have it, let's make sure that we keep it.
